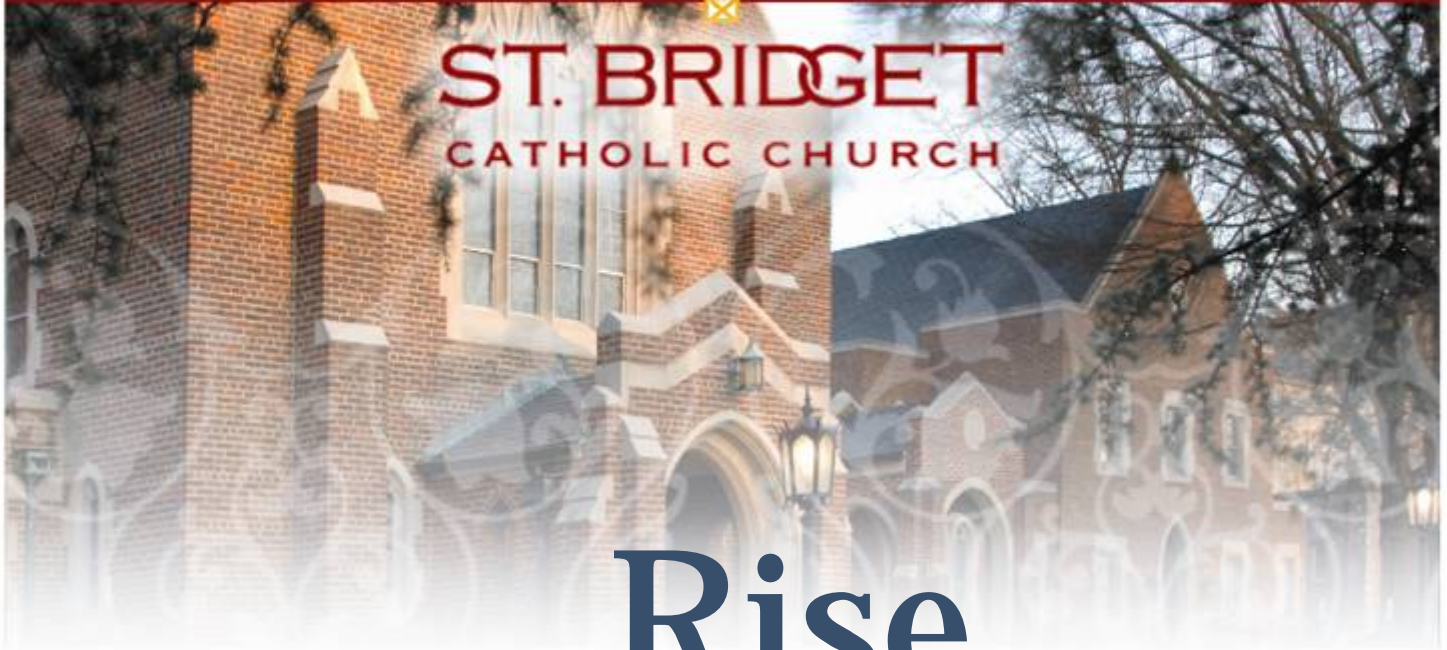

Solidarity in prayer on the National Day of Prayer and Penance for Life

As a gift from God, every human life is sacred from conception to natural death. As Christians, we have a duty to work to protect all people, for we are all brothers and sisters of a merciful Heavenly Father. We recognize that the right to life is the first and most fundamental principle of human rights, for it serves as the basis for the flourishing of all other human rights.

This year the National Day of Prayer and Penance for Life, established by the US Bishops falls on Monday, January 23rd. It has been set aside for earnest prayer for the full restoration of the legal guarantee of the right to life and of penance for violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion. It coincides with the Church's wider effort to point to the dignity of the human person and alleviate the harm done to the human family. All are invited to consider how they might bear witness to the dignity of the human person and defend the right to life. Below are opportunities provided in the parish:

Youth Night for Life: Sunday, January 15th – after the 5:00 PM Mass. Pizza Dinner will be provided followed by rosary, praise and worship music and testimonials.

Respect Life Holy Hour: Wednesday, January 18th – from 6:00 – 7:00 PM. The Holy Hour will include Exposition and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.

March for Life: Monday, January 23rd – 8:00 AM – 6:30 PM. The Knights of Columbus will provide free transportation to the annual National March for Life in Washington D.C. The day is connected with the January 22nd Anniversary of the Supreme Court case, Roe vs. Wade, from 1973 that legalized abortion. Mass for Life: Monday, January 23rd – 8:00 AM, regularly scheduled Mass.

Respect Life Holy Hour: Monday, January 23rd – 7:00 – 8:00 PM. The Holy Hour will include Exposition and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.

We especially encourage everyone to make an examination of conscience to consider ways in which we have acted against life and supported efforts that stand against human dignity. Please remember that the Church remains open on a daily basis so that we might sacrifice some time to draw near the Lord in silence and prayer in reparation for sins against life. Prayer and silence before the Lord in the Blessed Sacrament is a powerful means to healing for each of us!
