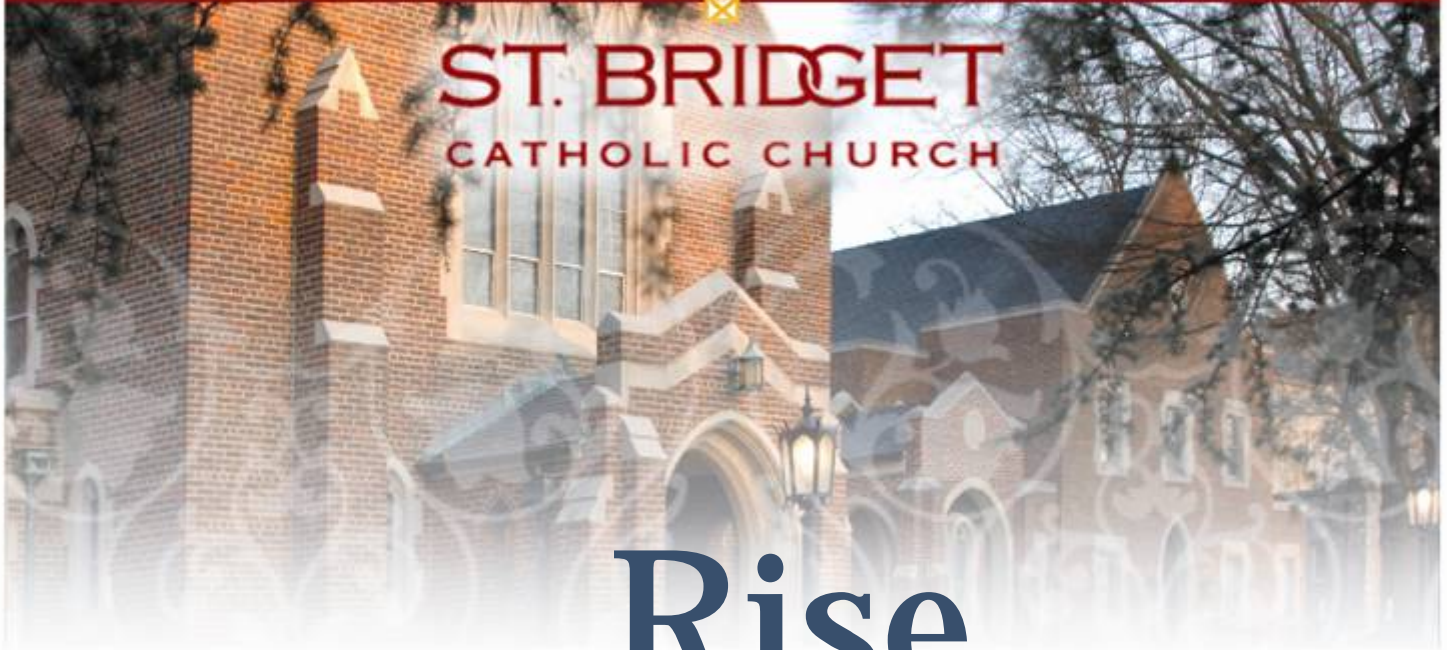

Dear Parishioner,

How grateful I am for your presence and help during Masses here at Saint Bridget Church. One of the great Gifts the Lord gives us is His Real Presence when two or three are gathered in His name. He also gives us specific ways in which we continue to encounter Him living here and now among us.

As you know, we are striving to participate with the Holy Spirit in creating liturgies that sing Christ's Real Presence. Since your ministry to the Lord at His table is a participation of Christ's gift of Real Presence, a time of formation and training is desirable and pleasing to God.

So important is this work of revealing Christ's presence that you must attend one of these gatherings every three years in order to continue serving.

Haiti Sponsorship Update:

So far this year we have 270 children sponsored between St. Bridget and Cathedral. This is nearly the same number we had sponsored last year. Thank you all that have sponsored. That is out of 500 students in our school in Carissade. We have 2,100 families here at St. Bridget alone. Think for a moment what it might be to not have been educated? When I lived in the rural parts of Africa among a mostly uneducated populace superstition and fear abounded. It wasn't that people were not smart they simply could not read nor did they know any basic science. Illness and death were not brought about by germs and disease but by genies or by wishes of other people. In our Education committee meeting with Fr. Bourdeau we learned of the special challenges facing rural children. Parents are unable to help the children in their studies and no tutors are available to help out. With farm work to do summer school is not an option. There is also no electricity to do homework and study. With class sizes already between 40 and 60 they are considering having students who do not pass the state exam after 6th grade repeat both 5th and 6th grade. What a dream it would be to build two more class rooms and hire two more teachers for those grades! It is not too late to sponsor a child. Please visit our website at www.thehaiticommitee.com.
