


While Mass is never canceled, event cancellations due to weather appear on the website.



What will I put in the basket?

The Sunday Offertory is an important ritual as we celebrate Mass. It signifies our support of the parish as a community ready and willing to live the Scriptures just proclaimed. Our young people – watching everything we do – see us making a sacrifice for the good of the parish. To allow those using E-giving to participate in the Sunday Offertory, you will find laminated cards in the Commons and church entrances. Those using online and bank draft are invited to take one as they enter the church and place it in the collection basket when it's passed. It will be received and blessed with our other gifts given this day. Thank you for your gift and for your prayers.

TRADITIONAL METHOD

- 1. Fill out and return your pledge card in the mail or collection basket.
 - 2. Use weekly offertory envelopes to fulfill your pledged contribution at Mass each week.

ONLINE METHOD

- 1. Submit your online pledge form through www.saintbridgetchurch.org/pledge.
- 2. Set your E-Giving account to make your contribution automatically each week.
