# **Human Concerns: Spotlight on Haiti**

In going through old meeting minutes for this ministry I noted they date back to 1991. That is 25 years of ministry to our brothers and sisters in Carissade. We have accomplished a great deal: a new chapel, school, cafeteria and a clinic for basic medical needs. We began educating children in an area where no one had received an education before. The value of an education cannot be underestimated. When you cannot read and write you are closed off from the world and myth is your explanation of the world. We have worked to educate the teachers so they can do a better job of educating the students. Over the years test scores have gone up. We have taken select students and sent them to further their education in a middle school in Hinche. It has been a slow process and the parishioners of St. Bridget and Cathedral have been faithful throughout in donating and making it all possible.




The earth-quake in Haiti in January of 2010 has made Haiti's lack of progress obvious and sent many in the development community

to reexamine what had been done and what needs to be done. A couple of years ago the Bishops of Haiti came together to respond to what needs to be done and set it down in a document. They set up a review process for themselves to make sure buildings constructed for the church in the future would be safer during earthquakes and they asked the donor community to go about their business in a different way. One sentence from the document they wrote speaks of this new direction, "The goal of any partnership should lead to sustainable development, according to the needs of the local church, and should be designed to reduce the need of outside help." Our own bishops made this the goal of the Campaign for Human Development when it was created in the 1970's to give those in poverty a hand up rather than a hand out. The CHD does this by funding projects that attack the structural roots of poverty. If we do this right in the true sense of solidarity the people of Carissade may one day shed the shackles of dependency and stand on their own feet.

For our Haiti ministry it means carrying on the commitments we have made and in particular; to step up our efforts of building solidarity with our brothers and sisters in Carissade, helping them to develop in an economically sustainable fashion. This is not the work of one individual but of a community. This will not happen without the will of St. Bridget and Cathedral parishioners. Solidarity calls for relationship between people of our community and that of St. Paul in Carissade. In 1987 Saint Pope John Paul II wrote, "Solidarity is not a feeling of vague compassion...but rather a firm and persevering determination to commit oneself to the common good." In the same document he called solidarity the virtue for the modern world. It is what is needed to overcome our selfishness and work together for the common good. What we see in our nation and in the world today may be the result of the failure to heed his words.

What we need are parishioners willing to build relationships with our brothers and sisters of Carissade, which means taking up the pilgrimage. Those who say yes to this calling will find their lives transformed by the spirit of God, as you will come face to face with those who are radically dependent on God's providence; something we all share but us wealthy folks are fooled into forgetting. Through the trust built by solidarity, the Holy Spirit will give the people of Carissade the grace and courage they need to build new lives, where freedom from "want" can be envisioned. The journey waits for you to take it up.

We are in the process of formation for what the parishioners of St. Bridget/ Cathedral will have this ministry become. Join us at our next formation session January 25 at 7 p.m. in the






Thank you! Your generosity has been a blessing to St. Bridget Church throughout this past year. Your continued support allows us to help our church family and spread God's Word throughout the world.

# St. Bridget Middle School: a gift to the whole parish family

Through the Grace of God and the hard work of many good people, St. Bridget Parish is expanding St. Bridget School to include a new Middle School just a block west of the church. In July the Parish purchased the Westhampton Baptist church, a 100 year old iconic architectural gem with the blessing of our Baptist friends. The congregation of 70 was unable to maintain the building and grounds and hoped to find a buyer who would respect the sacred space as well as make use of the classrooms. With that hope Reverend William Duganne, Pastor of Westhampton, approached Monsignor Carr with the idea of purchasing the church. After consultation with the school Parent Advisory Board, and with Bishop DiLorenzo's encouragement, Monsignor Carr set in motion the parishes' dream of more space for our parish school in the shadow of the church.

This new building will better serve the students who attend St. Bridget School preparing them for the future and providing an enhanced and vibrant educational space. The new Middle School will include a performing arts center, flexible classroom space, state of the art science lab, a collaboration lab and an outdoor classroom. In addition to the new building created especially for middle school learning, seven classrooms will be freed up for the elementary school allowing for a dedicated science lab as well as dedicated classrooms for foreign language study. The school will also add one junior kindergarten class in 2016 and another in 2017.

St. Bridget School is already a great school. Walk in the halls, visit a classroom or watch one of the student created videos – there is excitement for learning and many caring, talented people ensuring that our school offers a Christ centered, rigorous education. But beyond that it is a place that cares about the parishes' children and works every day to give them a loving, nurturing and challenging place to grow and learn. We are blessed to have this school in our parish and blessed to be able to expand and grow our school! Read on - Monsignor Carr answers a few questions and reflects on this next exciting project!

# How did the Parish come to own Westhampton Baptist Church?

The Westhampton Baptist pastor reached out to us. It was an email in which he inquired if we would like to buy their church. He explained that their membership had declined and that the church roof was in danger and they could not afford to repair it.

It did not take us long to express our interest (about a nanosecond!). This is because we knew of the ample Sunday School building connected to Westhampton Church. They hoped we would be committed to preserving the historic architecture and we will do that.

#### How do you feel about the project?

I feel excited and energized about this. We can develop a top notch middle school and refit some of the spaces in our current school building to welcome a junior kindergarten program and refit other areas. I am humble before God for this good gift.

There will be a performing arts space in the new school – you used to do a bit of directing back in your Parochial Vicar days can we expect to see you directing a play at the new school?

My directing days are long gone! What we really had here was a director's team and we staged three dinner-theaters: Murder In The Cathedral, Oliver and Sound of Music. We were able to attract first rate musicians, dance instructors, vocal coaches, stage crew and others. In the hands of these wonderful people were our parishioners: adults and children who rose to the occasion and presented spectacular performances. It was great for the fellowship of the parish. Some of the performers went on to acting in local theaters. It was a lot of fun and a lot of work.

How do you see the new school impacting our Parish? St. Bridget School has provided a couple of generations of Catholics who are leaders in Metropolitan Richmond, the diocese and of course in our parish. Our ability to grow the school and further its excellence while focusing on faith, this is a gift to the whole parish family. Children's faith and zeal influence us all because we are all one body in Christ!
