Human Concerns Spotlight: CrossOver Ministries

CrossOver Healthcare Ministry is a charitable Clinic that provides healthcare to low income individuals in our community who do not have health insurance in the name of Jesus Christ. CrossOver transforms the lives of our patients by providing compassionate care to each individual: Mind, Body, and Spirit. The number of individuals in our community who need CrossOver services continues to grow, and we need YOUR help to meet the need. In 2016, CrossOver has big plans to provide comprehensive and quality care to those who need healthcare. Currently, they are turning away people who need their help because they don't have enough resources to serve them. They are asking you to partner with them to help spread the word about the need in our community and opportunities for missions, right here in Richmond. You can help them in so many ways:

Prayer. Please pray for CrossOver's ministry and all their patients who need compassionate care.

Donate. St. Bridget will host speakers at all the Masses and have a second collection the weekend of April 17.

Volunteer. Over 60% of care at CrossOver is a direct result of volunteerism. Increasing their volunteer pool allows them to increase their capacity to serve patients. As a ministry, they want to partner with those in the faith community to make that possible.

Spread the word. Getting the word out about their services and volunteer opportunities can make such a huge difference!

Lack of access to healthcare is a huge problem in our state. The CrossOver clinic by Regency Square pulls in people from

Saint Bridget sent over 70 teens and chaperones to Jamestown for an overnight retreat on the river- it was an incredible experience! The teens listened to talks on the role of the Holy Spirit in their lives and spent time in prayer and reflection throughout the day before a fun afternoon with field games, archery and team building relay races. The retreat focused two particular relationships, the personal relationship they have with God and the relationship they have with each other and the community around them. The teens were challenged to strengthen both of these relationships with the Gifts and Fruits of the Holy Spirit that they receive in Confirmation. To illustrate the fire and power of the Holy Spirit (and to provide


St. Bridget Parish Annual Lenten Fish Fry-March 11th - Get Your Tickets Now!
